# FIRST MONTH

*Identify themes & situations, find scholarships, & talk to counselors*

## 1ST WEEK

- Create a new email account to use to find scholarships
- Complete profiles on [www.Fastweb.org](http://www.Fastweb.org) & [www.Chegg.com](http://www.Chegg.com)

## 2ND WEEK

- Identify 4 themes from the list below
  - Academics
  - Athletics
  - Creative talents
  - Ethnic background
  - Service
  - Activism
  - Character
  - Entrepreneurship
  - Leadership
  - Survivor
- Complete the profiles on [Scholarships.com](http://Scholarships.com), [CollegeBoard.com](http://CollegeBoard.com), & [MyScholly.com](http://MyScholly.com)

## 3RD WEEK

- Add 3 situations for each theme selected last week
- Review scholarships on the Counseling or Financial Aid section of high school & college web sites
- Use your themes and locations to identify scholarships on [ScholarshipLibrary.org](http://ScholarshipLibrary.org)
- Review articles on Scholarships Scams on [www.FinAid.org](http://www.FinAid.org) to avoid scams & frauds

## 4TH WEEK

- Talk to high school guidance and college financial aid counselors
- Use your themes to identify scholarships on [CareerOneStop.org](http://CareerOneStop.org) & [AIE.org](http://AIE.org)
- Ask teachers to choose a scholarship topic for writing homework assignments instead of their assigned topics

## SECOND MONTH

***Continue finding scholarships, refine scholarship statements, solicit letters of recommendation***

### 1ST WEEK

- Register on [www.Reddit.com](https://www.Reddit.com) sub reddit r/scholarships, and [www.Scholarships.net](https://www.Scholarships.net)
- Select one of your themes and identify 3 specific examples for each situation
  - Write brief descriptions of examples to prompt your memory
  - These will form the basis of what we call scholarship statements to prove you deserve their money
- Identify & contact 5 people you can ask to give you letters of recommendation

### 2ND WEEK

- Refine each of your scholarship statements for that theme in the following ways (Refine each statement separately. Do not combine these steps)
  - Turn each example into a sentence. Just get it down and don't try to edit it as you write it
  - Identify all implied numbers in your sentence. Exchange the implied numbers for real \$, #, or %s. Use alpha-numeric symbols rather than words

### 3RD WEEK

- Draft a letter of recommendation for one of the people who agreed to submit a letter of recommendation for you
- Refine the scholarship statements you created last week in the following ways (Refine each statement separately. Do not combine these steps)
  - Identify any jargon in each sentence, then translate those terms in phrases that cannot be misunderstood
  - Identify any use of the passive voice shifts in tense & person, then edit to active voice, tense, & person for each sentence
  - Upgrade the vocabulary in each sentence to sound more sophisticated and professional

### 4TH WEEK

- Ask an English teacher or other professional to review and edit your scholarship statements
- Send your first letter of recommendation to the submitter
  - Ask him or her to edit the drafted letter to their personal satisfaction
  - Ask him or her to print it on their letterhead and send you both the hardcopy and a PDF copy of the letter
- Draft letters of recommendation for 2 of the other people who agreed to submit one

# THIRD MONTH

***Start applying for scholarships, refine more scholarship statements, & draft additional letters of recommendation***

## 1ST WEEK

- Select another one of your themes and identify 3 specific examples for each situation
  - Write brief descriptions of examples to prompt your memory
  - These will form the basis of what we call scholarship statements to prove you deserve their money
- Submit the two drafts of letters of recommendation you wrote last week to the submitter
  - Ask those people to edit the drafted letter to their personal satisfaction
  - Ask him or her to print it on their letterhead and send you both the hardcopy and a PDF copy of the letter

## 2ND WEEK

- Refine each of your scholarship statements for the theme you selected in the following ways
  - Turn each example into a sentence. Just get it down and don't try to edit it as you write it
  - Identify all implied numbers in your sentence. Exchange the implied numbers for real \$, #, or %s. Use alpha-numeric symbols rather than words
- Submit 2 applications for scholarships seeking to reward what you described in your first theme
  - Create a document titled <Your name> Scholarship Master Application
  - Copy answers not included in your master application from scholarship applications you complete into your master application
  - Copy and paste answers from your master application into applications you will submit

## 3RD WEEK

- Draft a letter of recommendation for the 2 other people who agreed to submit one
- Refine the scholarship statements you created last week in the following ways
  - Identify any jargon in each sentence, then translate those terms in phrases that cannot be misunderstood
  - Identify any use of the passive voice shifts in tense & person, then edit to active voice, tense, & person for each sentence
  - Upgrade the vocabulary in each sentence to sound more sophisticated and professional
- Submit 2 more applications for scholarships seeking to reward what you described in your first theme

## 4TH WEEK

  - Ask him or her to print it on their letterhead and send you both the hardcopy and a PDF copy of the letter
- Submit 2 more applications for scholarships seeking to reward what you described in your first theme
  - Copy answers not included in your master application from scholarship applications you complete into your master application
  - Copy and paste answers from your master application into applications you will submit

## FOURTH MONTH

*Apply for scholarships, refine more scholarship statements, & draft essays*

### 1ST WEEK

- Select another one of your themes and identify 3 specific examples for each situation
  - Write brief descriptions of examples to prompt your memory
  - These will form the basis of what we call scholarship statements to prove you deserve their money
- Begin writing 5-6 reusable essays for scholarship applications
  - Review web sites listing top essay topics solicited for scholarships on Reddit & [www.WiseEssays.com](http://www.WiseEssays.com)  
<https://www.wiseessays.com/blog/scholarship-essay-prompts>
  - Review essays you have already written for previous homework assignments to identify essays you may use to apply for scholarships

### 2ND WEEK

  - Copy answers not included in your master application from scholarship applications you complete into your master application
  - Copy and paste answers from your master application into applications you will submit

# FIFTH MONTH

*Apply for scholarships, refine more scholarship statements, & draft essays*

## 1ST WEEK

- Select another one of your themes and identify 3 specific examples for each situation
  - Write brief descriptions of examples to prompt your memory
  - These will form the basis of what we call scholarship statements to prove you deserve their money
- Review the list of essay topics and select 2 topics that will require original essays for you to write this month
  - Review web sites listing top essay topics solicited for scholarships on Reddit & [www.WiseEssays.com](http://www.WiseEssays.com)  
<https://www.wiseessays.com/blog/scholarship-essay-prompts>
  - Outline the essays using outlines, quotes, statistics, scholarship statements, and personal stories

## 2ND WEEK

- Refine each of your scholarship statements for the theme you selected in the following ways
  - Turn each example into a sentence. Just get it down and don't try to edit it as you write it
  - Identify all implied numbers in your sentence. Exchange the implied numbers for real \$, #, or %s. Use alpha-numeric symbols rather than words

  - Save customized essays as <scholarship name> Essay Submission by <Your name>.PDF s

### 2ND WEEK

- Submit 3 applications copying and pasting answers from your master application and scholarship statements
- Copy and & paste scholarship statements into fields asking for examples or descriptions of specific experiences
- Upload reusable letters of recommendation as requested
- Modify and upload modified, reusable essays as requested
