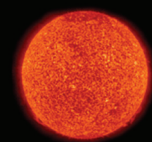

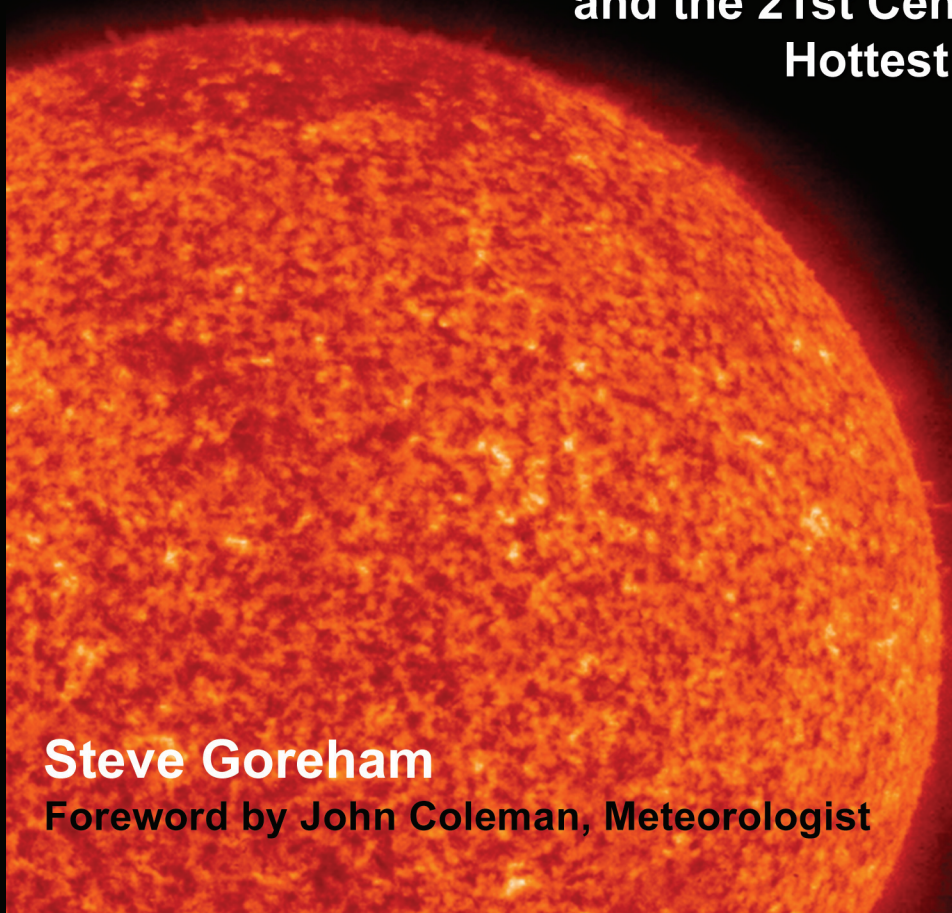

Foreword by John Coleman, Meteorologist

The news media bombards us daily with warnings about the dire consequences of climate change: melting ice caps, rising seas, droughts, floods, hurricanes, disease, polar bear extinction, and acid oceans. Political leaders, academics, scientists, business leaders, and major international organizations such as the United Nations have placed mankind on a course to adopt renewable energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and "save the planet."

Yet, in 2009 the United States experienced one of the coolest summers on record. Hurricane activity in the Atlantic Ocean has dropped to near zero. Arctic sea ice has been growing for two years, since a 30-year low in 2007. And scientists now agree that Earth has been cooling for at least the last eight years.

Steve Goreham takes a complete, common-sense look at the science, politics, and energy-policy aspects of global warming. With more than 400 pages and 135 figures, he demonstrates that climate change is due to natural causes, not man-made emissions of greenhouse gases. Therefore, a misguided mankind is engaged in a futile effort to control Earth's temperature, imposing draconian policies that will limit our freedoms and radically transform our way of life.

But Goreham goes deeper, introducing the concept of *Climatism*, a new global ideology, as the driver of this man-made global warming delusion. Led by the United Nations and adopted by governments of the world, Climatism is bent on transforming Western lifestyles and halting economic progress in the developing world.
