

# AV Rider

## for Ryan Jenkins

For your audience's ultimate experience, please have the following available at your event.



### Computer, Projectors, and Displays

Ryan provides his own Apple MacBook Pro 16-inch 2021 running macOS Sequoia version 15.0. Ryan will have with him the necessary Apple adapters (if needed).

### Audio

Ryan can use the standard 3.5mm analog headphone jack, USB-C ports, or HDMI, whichever you prefer. Please note that an audio connection is required.

### AV Testing / Soundcheck

Ryan requires an AV check no fewer than 30 minutes before taking the stage.

### Microphone

Ryan requires a wireless lavalier or "countryman" microphone connected to a professional audio system. A handheld for audience questions is recommended (if applicable).

### Slide Advancer

The client must provide a DSAN Perfect Cue system (or equivalent) for Ryan's direct slide control, which connects to his laptop via a USB or USB-C port.

### Computer Location

Ryan does not need his computer on stage with him. In fact, he prefers the computer to be placed with the AV crew so it doesn't clutter up the stage.

### Video

Ryan has a direct HDMI port, and his entire presentation is presented from his computer using Apple Keynote slides with a 16:9 display ratio at 1919 x 1080. Please note, it is not ideal for Ryan's presentation to be loaded on a "show computer" as he utilizes custom slides, animations, text, etc.

### No Podium

Ryan prefers no podium on stage. If one must be present, it's recommended it be pushed back so he may walk in front of it unencumbered.

### Beverage

Please have a bottle of water available to Ryan while on stage.

### Internet Access

Ryan will conduct live polling during his presentation, which requires an internet connection (Wi-Fi or hardline). Ryan uses PollEverywhere embedded in his slides. No set-up is required by the AV team or audience.

### Confidence Monitor

Ryan strongly prefers at least one confidence monitor, along with a countdown clock, if possible. Note: Ryan will not need to view presenter notes; just view what the audience is viewing.

### Note

Speaker can provide a copy of the slides in advance and will bring a back-up on USB to the event.
