Who is Darby?

With over 15 years of experience in accessibility strategy, Darby Young, CVP (2025), is one of North America's leading voices in inclusive design. As a Certified Venue Professional, ADA Coordinator, and founder of Level Playing Field Inc., Darby combines lived experience, technical expertise, and a deep understanding of how accessibility intersects with design, operations, and the guest experience. Her work helps organizations move beyond code compliance to create spaces that are inclusive, functional, and welcoming for everyone.

Darby founded Level Playing Field (LPF) in 2015 with a mission to eliminate barriers in the built environment and support truly inclusive design. Today, LPF consults across Canada and the United States on a wide range of projects, including education campuses, entertainment venues, civic infrastructure, corporate spaces, and masterplans. Darby is often brought in early to help design teams integrate accessibility from day one and avoid costly retrofits.

Darby brings deep technical training to her work. She is a Certified Venue Professional (CVP)(2025), a Certified ADA Coordinator (ADAC), and an IOC Safeguarding Officer in Sport. She also holds accessibility certification through the Rick Hansen Foundation. These credentials reflect her hands-on approach to accessibility, from design to operations to the guest experience.

Her career is deeply rooted in lived experience. Born with mild cerebral palsy, Darby grew up navigating barriers that weren't always visible to others. That perspective shaped her passion for change and fueled her success as a competitive para-alpine skier, where she pushed physical limits and defied expectations. She has also spent years working behind the scenes in high-pressure event environments. Darby's expertise in Team Services gives her a deep understanding of the logistical needs for athletes, staff, and organizers, as well as the unique challenges of being a disabled staffer in an able-bodied sports world. Her experience includes contributions to the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics and Paralympics, the World Hockey Championships, and the World Junior Hockey Championships.









As a speaker, Darby delivers high-impact keynotes that blend real-world stories with practical advice. Her sessions help audiences reframe accessibility as both a business opportunity and a human responsibility. She has spoken at VenueConnect, A4LE Southern, BuildEX, and CANU, and regularly presents to design firms, corporate teams, and public sector leaders across North America.

Darby's leadership and impact have been widely recognized. She was named one of Canada's Top 40 Under 40, one of the Top 25 Women of Influence, and received the Calgary Stampede Western Legacy Award for innovation.

Her personal philosophy is rooted in resilience and humor: "We all fall at some point. What matters is how we get back up. Laughing along the way helps." Darby always says, "Watch your ankles, scoots likes to make friends."
